INTRODUCTION



The Paychex Junior Achievement Discovery Center is a reality-based learning environment serving 4th through 12th grade students throughout the greater Rochester Region. This educational model is sequential and immersive, providing a relevant connection between what is taught in the classroom and what is happening in the world of work, between "learning and earning."

Each program encompasses 13 lessons in the classroom, followed by a visit to this authentic minicity, with replica businesses and organizations that make up our community and our workforce.

In JA BizTown, community volunteers guide students as they become active members of our local economy. Throughout the day-long experience, JA BizTown citizens perform jobs, run our local businesses, open bank accounts, spend their earnings within a budget, elect a mayor and sell services and consumer goods to each other.

A few years later in JA Finance Park, middle and high school students take on new lives, with careers, families, credit scores and other adult obligations. They once again become active members of our local economy, receiving guidance from volunteer role models to make the financial decisions that support the lives they envision.

The Paychex Junior Achievement Discovery Center is developing critical financial self-sufficiency, workforce readiness and entrepreneurial skills in youth, while helping to address many of the most pressing needs in our community, including generational poverty and a lack of skilled workers in a variety of industries.



Built to educate and designed to inspire, students will see first-hand the boundless possibilities available right here in our Region.

2024 JA BizTown IMPACT SNAPSHOT



JA BizTown citizens are surveyed before and after program implementation. The following percentage said that JA BizTown taught them:

- 89% The importance of having a bank account.
- How to deposit a check and use earnings to save and spend.
- 83% How to be a responsible citizen, including the importance of voting.
- 83% How businesses work together in a community.
- 83% The importance of teamwork.

On average, 79% of Biz Town students answered skill/knowledge-based questions correctly after participating in the classroom lessons and the simulation experience.

2024 JA Finance Park IMPACT SNAPSHOT



The following students agreed or strongly agreed that their JA Finance Park experience helped them:

- **94%** Understand how a budget works.
- 91% See the need for adjustments to a budget in order to live within a particular salary.
- **92%** Be better prepared for budget challenges when they arise.
- 90% Be better prepared for college or the workplace.
- 85% Explore new career opportunities.

In addition, 93% of students said their interaction with their volunteer during the simulation had a positive influence on their personal development.


